Health Panel Speaker: David Marsh

David Marsh, MD, MPH is a pediatrician and international public health physician who has worked with Save the Children for 16 years, currently as Senior Advisor for Child Survival. Prior experience includes: 5 years as professor in the Department of Community Health Sciences at the Aga Khan University Medical College in Karachi, Pakistan; 6 years as a general pediatrician in Amherst, Massachusetts where he still resides; and 5 years as a Major in the US Public Health Service on the Navajo Reservation in New Mexico. He is a graduate of Williams College ('71), the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry ('75), and the Harvard University School of Public Health ('90). Dr. Marsh is the Global Team Leader of Save the Children's Community Case Management (CCM) Initiative in 20 countries. As part of the Global Action Plan for Pneumonia Control, he led a review of developing countries' CCM programs, policies and plans for the *Bulletin of the World Health Organization*. He is a founding member of the global CCM Task Force and Operations Research Group. His advocacy for childhood pneumonia control helped catalyze the first ever World Pneumonia Day on November 2, 2009.
